PORTLAND, OR – Providence Cancer Center announces the addition of two new medical directors to programs in head and neck cancer, and gynecologic oncology.

Bryan Bell, M.D., D.D.S, has been named medical director of Providence Head, Neck and Oral Cancer Program. A physician with Head and Neck Surgical Associates in Portland, Dr. Bell is a board-certified surgeon who brings extensive experience in evaluation and treatment of a variety of head and neck tumors involving the oral cavity, larynx, pharynx, nose, paranasal sinuses, thyroid and salivary glands.

Providence Head, Neck and Oral Cancer Program offers care for patients with benign and malignant tumors of the oral cavity, tongue, larynx and other skull-based tumors. Dr. Bell will oversee a multidisciplinary treatment team of oncologists, radiologists, dentists, nurses, speech pathologists, audiologists, nutritionists and social workers to provide optimal tumor control, and maximal functional and aesthetic outcomes to patients.

Paul Tseng, M.D., is the new medical director of the gynecologic oncology program at Providence Cancer Center. Dr. Tseng is a board-certified surgeon with a focus on the diagnosis, treatment and management of ovarian, uterine, cervical and other female reproductive cancers. He is a member of Northwest Cancer Specialists.

Dr. Tseng will lead a multidisciplinary team of providers who offer surgical intervention, chemotherapy management and palliative care for women reproductive cancers He specializes in minimally-invasive robotic surgery, a technology that can be performed in women who otherwise might not be candidates for standard laparoscopy.
